### **St. Anthony Of Padua – June 13<sup>th</sup>**

When many Catholics lose something, the first thing they do is pray to St. Anthony. All around the world, people implore his intercession to find everything from lost keys to lost souls.

How a Franciscan priest became a celestial lost-and-found department is uncertain. One legend says that when a friar stole a book, Anthony prayed it would be returned. The sticky-fingered friar was overcome with remorse and brought the book back. Regardless how St. Anthony got associated with the recovery of lost items, he is one of the world's favorite saints.

Anthony was the son of Portuguese nobility. He first joined the Augustinians, but when the relics of Franciscan order. Beloved as a preacher and teacher, he was canonized within a year after his death.

Although we usually pray to St. Anthony to help us find things, we can also ask him to help us lose at least one thing. If you are overweight, St. Anthony can sympathize. He was short and chubby, hardly a lean ascetic. Since he knows what it is like to struggle with weight, he might just be a good patron to call on when you begin dieting to fit into a swimming suit or shorts. Who knows? Since most of St. Anthony's time is spent finding things, he might be glad to hear a request to lose something.

### **World Day Of Prayer for Priests – June 15<sup>th</sup>**



Blessed John Paul II has established that on the solemnity of the Sacred Heart the Church will observe the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. We encourage each and every one of the faithful to pray for our priests today, this very moment, in preparation through prayer, celebration of the Mass and Eucharistic Adoration, so that the 15th June 2012 will be an even greater celebration of the priesthood of Jesus Christ worldwide.

### **Feast of the Sacred Heart**

On 25th August 1856, Blessed Pope Pius IX inscribed the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart in the Calendar of the Catholic Church, directing that it be celebrated on the Friday after the Octave of Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ) each year. He was responding to a formal request made by Jesus Himself almost two centuries earlier in 1675 to a French Visitation nun, Margaret Mary Alacoque. This saintly woman was later to be canonized on May 13<sup>th</sup>, 1920, just five days before the birth of Blessed Pope John Paul II, who, towards the end of his great Pontificate would nominate the Feast of the Sacred Heart a special Day of Prayer for Priests.

Jesus expressed His wish that the Feast of the Sacred Heart be a day of reparation, not for sins in general, but specifically for sins against the Eucharist which St Albert the Great considered the first gift of the Sacred Heart. This great Dominican teacher of St Thomas Aquinas marvelled at how the institution of the Eucharist was a source of great joy to the Sacred Heart; "His Heart overflowed with love and joy at being completely one with us and filling our hearts with joy and jubilation".

## The Eucharist is a Single Sacrifice

The Eucharist is the sacrament that Christ gave us during the Last Supper. On that night, he took the bread and the wine, consecrated it, shared it with his disciples, and invited us to participate in this one, single sacrifice until he comes again. "Do this in memory of me."



## The Eucharist: Real Presence of Christ with Us

The Eucharist is not just a memorial of Christ's life, death, and resurrection; it is how Christ remains with us in a tangible way. When we receive the Eucharist, we receive Jesus Christ, himself! We affirm our belief in this sacrament, this gift of grace, and we invite Christ to work within us. By the power of the Holy Spirit, the bread and wine become Christ's true Body and Blood.

Many have experienced healing from this sacrament. Receiving the Eucharist forgives venial sins and preserves one from grave sins (CCC #1416); however, anyone who is guilty of a mortal sin must sincerely seek absolution in the sacrament of Reconciliation before receiving communion (CCC #1415).

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us (his) flesh to eat?"

Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life in you. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." (John 6:51-56)
